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Practitioners' Corner

"Life is a mirror and will reflect back to the thinker what he thinks into it" — Ernest Holmes

It's good to stay in the question, yet not when it comes to prayer. Many say...*"I cannot seem to remember the steps to treatment"*.

Let's relax and look at the natural flow of prayer. The steps give us clarity; bring our thoughts and feelings into unity and form our reality. Try seeing the steps as scaffolding. They are in front and support what it is we want to manifest. Once built, that scaffolding can come down, clearly showing and experiencing the Spiritual Truth. 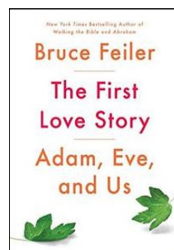
